- Introduce the Brain Injury Family Intervention for families of adults affected by ABI (BIFI); and for families of adolescents ages 13 to 19 years (BIFI-A).
- Provide a theoretical framework and structured approach for working with families after ABI.
- Teach clinical intervention techniques, case problem solving, and evaluation techniques.

- Focuses on skill building, psychosocial support, and education about ABI.
- Uses a protocol that is structured and scripted to facilitate implementation by clinicians.
- Draws upon family discussion, vignettes, role plays and interactive exercises.

- · Being a teen and achieving independence.
- · Coping with loss and change.
- · Managing intense emotions.
- · Setting s.m.a.r.t. goals and tracking progress.
- · School and transition planning.
